There were many stories shared, prayers raised and encouragement given on behalf of those continuing to push forward in recovery. The Drug Free Communities Grant in partnership with the Ada Police Department and ABLE Agents (Alcohol Beverage Licensing Enforcement) completed three rounds of alcohol compliance checks within this first year of the DFC grant. Unfortunately, the rates of non-compliance has gradually risen from 25% in March to 37% in August. We hope to begin to see a decrease this next DFC year. Our goal is to continue the routine checks in an effort to hold businesses accountable . Ultimately, we want to see every server of alcohol properly trained through Responsible Beverage Service and Sales Training. We plan to begin with small policy changes such as mandating Responsible Beverage Service and Sales Training for those who fail compliance checks.

In July, STAND members got the pleasure of meeting Deputy Wood and K-9 Officer Gallagher. They work with the Pontotoc County Sherriff's Office. K-9 Gallagher is a narcotics and human tracking dog. Deputy Wood talked to the youth about his partner and explained how a K-9 officer works and is trained. Deputy Wood demonstrated how Gallagher tracks narcotics and alerts. It was a very interesting presentation and the members really enjoyed it!

Also in July, PCDFC and BWI hosted a workshop with Oklahoma Bureau of Narcotics Director Darrell Weaver. He spoke about Prescription Drug Abuse and the crisis we face in Oklahoma. He graciously allowed us to use the registration fees to benefit the STAND coalition. This has helped with food for meetings as well as stipends for youth who help with alcohol compliance checks.
